In Commemoration of the 150th Anniversary of the Birth of Sigmund Freud — An Invitation to graduate students and young scholars in the field of Psychotherapy

This workshop is an opportunity for you to join with others who share your concern about how to translate the ways and means of psychotherapy to suit the needs of a globalized world in a state of flux and turmoil. Please join us for explorations into how to refine new approaches in psychotherapy that will allow us to carry the torch we have received from Sigmund Freud into the new century and beyond.
